

## **Andrew Mallalieu**

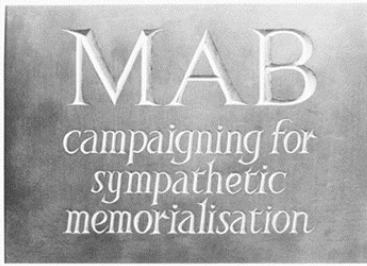
### **Vice President, Technical Affairs - Facultatieve Technologies**

Andrew Mallalieu entered the incineration and cremation industry in 1973 after graduating with a first class honours degree in Fuel and Combustion Engineering from the University of Leeds.

In 1978 he was appointed as Technical Manager at Evans Universal Ltd. and Technical Director in 1993. In 2001 he became Vice President of Facultatieve Technologies, the world market leader in the field of design, construction and maintenance of cremators and cremation equipment.

Previously a member of the DEFRA Working Group for the revision of the Process Guidance Note PG5/2 the Secretary of State's Guidance for Crematoria, Andrew is currently a Member of the Energy Institute, of which he is the Honorary Secretary of the Yorkshire Branch, a member of the Combustion Engineering Association and a Chartered Engineer.

Dr. Ian Hussein has been employed within the cemeteries and crematoria industry for 22 years and is currently the Director of the City of London Cemetery.

He holds the Institute of Cemetery and Crematorium Management (ICCM) Diploma, MSc in Public Service Management and a Doctorate in Professional Studies, and over the past two years has undertaken a course study in Conservation and Change with the Architectural Association.

Presently, he is an advisor to the European Federation of Funeral Services Cemeteries and Crematorium Technical Group, as well as the International Cremation Federation Technical Committee. He is also the technical and policy advisor to the Local Government Association on burial and cremation matters.

Dr. Hussein is a member of the DCA's Burial and Cremation Advisory Group and has undertaken advisory work on cemeteries and crematoria in Ireland, France, Germany, Serbia and Russia.

In the past, he has presented numerous papers on burial and cremation matters at national and international conferences, and was an opening witness to the Parliamentary Select Committee Inquiry into Cemeteries in 2001.

Having held the positions of Past National Secretary and Past President of the ICCM, which has awarded him Fellowship and Life Membership for his contribution to the development of cemeteries, crematoria and bereavement services.
